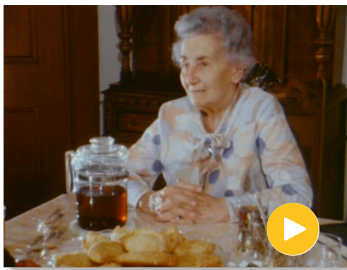

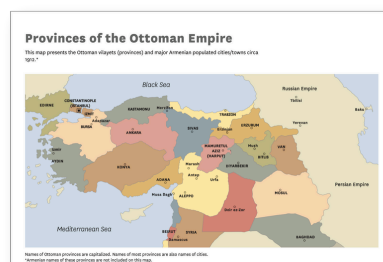
Standards-aligned digital activities forge personal connections with diverse subjects and topics.
